Chiltern 20 Challenge Hike – 2015

The annual Chiltern 20 Challenge Hike was attended by over 300 Scouts last weekend with another thrilling and skill developing adventure day for young people from across London and over several counties including Buckinghamshire, Hertfordshire and Devon.

The Hike was celebrating its 35th consecutive year and there were record numbers of Scouts who attended the event with 76 different teams from 32 different scout groups. The hike was a test of physical ability as well as good orienteering. All walkers received an individual certificate which they can use to pass part of the Teamwork Challenge Badge.

The Hike started and finished at Icknield Community College, Oxfordshire where the teams registered and went through a thorough kit check before setting off at 07:30hrs. This year they introduced two levels of the Challenge; a Junior event and a Senior event. The Junior event had a slightly shorter route and was aimed at younger Scouts to encourage them to take part in this exciting memorable event and the Senior event was slightly longer and was divided into two entry levels depending on if they would be accompanied by an adult or not.

The 6th Friern Barnet team, 'One Step at a Time', came first for the Junior event with a record time of 4hours 3minutes, and the Trekking Tigers from the 6th Southgate, following a close second with just 4 hours 9minutes. The Senior event had the Phoenix Flyers from the 201st Islington group finish first with a total time of 4hours 58minutes and Devon Rockets from the 20th Torbay, who followed closely behind.

Kitty, aged 13, from 8th Holborn, who has also taken on the role of Cinderella in this year's Pantomime, said:

"What a brilliant day, and so well organised. I have never walked so far in my life before".

Event Chairman, Volunteer and Scout Leader Colin Batsford, said:

"As a Scout Leader, training the young people in our charge in various skills is very fulfilling in itself. But to see them use those skills successfully makes it all the more worthwhile. To see the Scouts out there in the great outdoors, where young people should be, using their skills together with their mates, having fun and achieving something, one cannot be anything other than inspiring".
